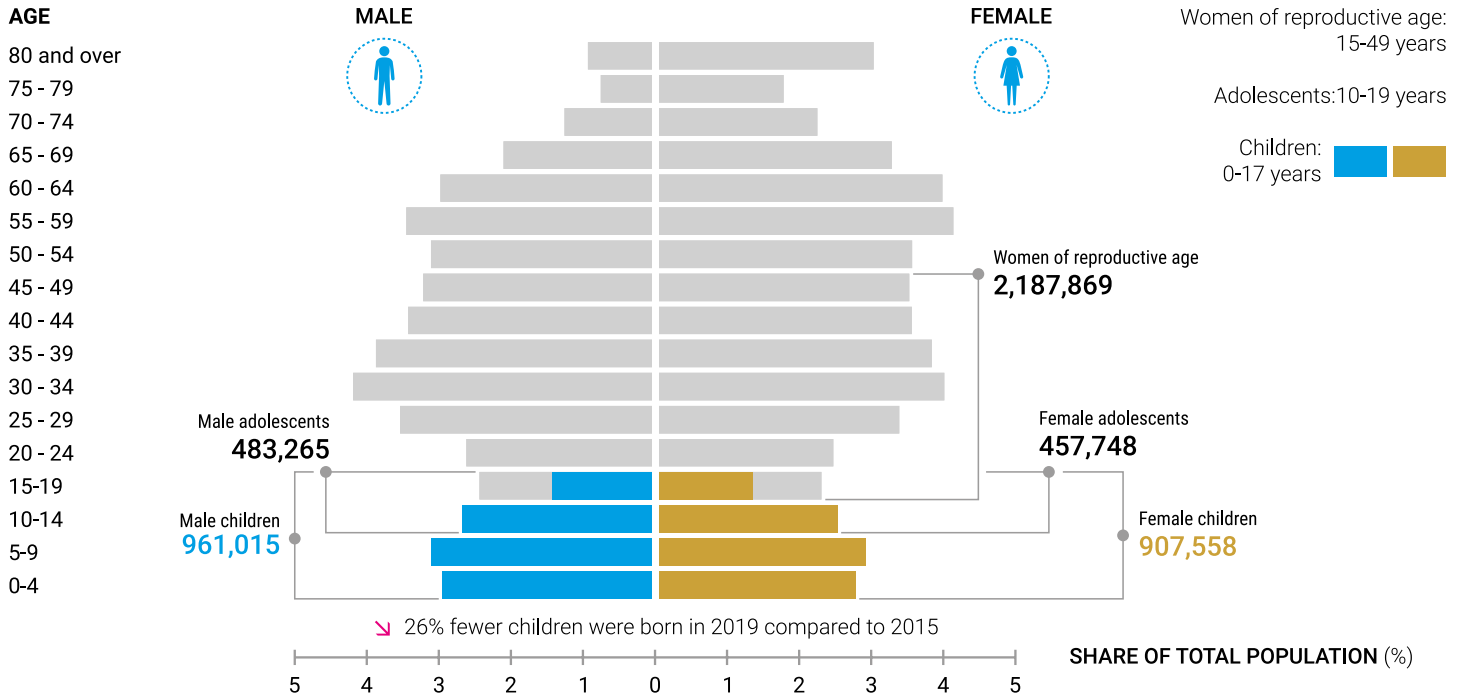

This Country Profile is based on an assessment of 49 indicators concerning children in the 2030 agenda. These indicators are grouped into five broad dimensions of child rights that cut across the Sustainable Development Goals. The five dials below illustrate the country's status in each dimension, based on an assessment of indicator performance against global targets. Each dial reveals what proportion of country indicators have met the global target, are on track to meet the target by 2030, require acceleration to reach the global target by 2030, or have no data, or insufficient data to plot trends. The assessment of progress is based on the methodology of the European Commission and UNICEF¹. The methodology is presented in the Baseline Report "Achieving the Sustainable Development Goals for Children and Adolescents", prepared by the Scientific Research Institute of the Ministry of Economy of the Republic of Belarus with the support of UNICEF. The national indicator framework consists mainly of a subset of the global framework with some adaptations (proxy) for indicators that do not have a compilation methodology and for which data are currently not available in Belarus. Proxy indicators are indicated by four digits, where the first three digits correspond to the numerical designations of global indicators, the fourth digit is the index number of the proxy indicator. For indicators, the data of which were obtained as a result of the MICS, are given for 2019 (mics.unicef.org/surveys).
